HCI International 2011 invites you to participate in the international forum for the dissemination and exchange of up-to-date scientific information on the theoretical, generic, and applied areas of Human-Computer Interaction (HCI). The conference takes place from July 9-14 2011 July 9-14 2011, at Hilton Orlando Bonnet Creek, Orlando, Florida, USA.

A new study that will be presented on Thursday at the HCI International 2011, investigates the following questions:

- How do users go to a specific web application or website?
- How do users make sure that the sites they are using are safe and reliable?
- Assuming that a user has landed on the right and secure web application, how are the users authenticated?
- How do users deal with multiple passwords?
- How do users deal with forgotten passwords?
- How reliable and secure are the security questions asked to authenticate users?

The findings show users' pattern of behavior in checking security when viewing a web application, the way they deal with numerous passwords and the retrieval of forgotten passwords using security questions. The research concludes points such as how most people are able to answer a variety of security questions for other people in their entourage. Users also seem to have significantly different behaviors statistically by both age group and level of expertise.
